- 1. Central College of Cosmetology has signed and returned to the Department the Certification Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under section 18004(a)(1) of CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
- 2. Central College of Cosmetology has received or will receive \$56,177 from the Department pursuant to the institutions Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- 3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of today, June 23, 2020, is \$56,177.
- 4. The estimated number of students at Central College of Cosmetology that are eligible to participate in this program is 35.
- 5. The total number of students who have received financial aid grants under this section is 35.
- 6. Grants were disbursed in 3 installments. Students received grants as follows:
 - 19 Students received grants for \$2125.07
 - 3 Students received grants for \$600.00
 - 4 Students received grants for \$1800.00
 - 5 Students received grants for \$1625.35
 - 4 other students received grants ranging from \$1062.59 to \$1525.07
- 7. Students have received verbal announcements in classes to apply with the school's director for financial grants under the CARES act. Students that did not apply have received either texts or phone calls from the school encouraging them to contact their school director so that they may apply.
- 8. Central College of Cosmetology has received \$56,177.00 from the Department pursuant to the institutions Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to the Institution.
- 9. The funds for the institutional grant was expended as follows:
