<u>Course Description:</u> The primary purpose of the Manicuring course is to train students in both theory and practical experience, which will prepare them for entry level positions in manicuring. The Course is particularly directed toward developing in the student desirable habits and attitudes with respect to health, sanitation and safety and encourages self-reliance, readiness to assist others, and an ethical approach to this profession.

References: The school uses books, texts, and web-based materials to support the program of study.

Objectives:

- To create an excitable environment of instruction and support services to enable the students to complete the program in a timely manner.
- > To professionally train students to excel in all areas of Manicuring offered on the clinic floor.
- To develop a curriculum which trains students, both in theory and practical aspects of manicuring, so they may successfully pass the State Board Exam.
- To offer complete instruction, support services, job placement, and Academic Advising assistance so the student is successfully employed in the field of Manicuring.
- > To promote a professional relationship with each student so they may become a valuable tool used by the school, in the constant strive for improvement.

Grading Scale: The qualitative element used to determine academic progress is a reasonable system of grades as determined by assigned academic learning. Students are assigned academic learning and a minimum number of practical experiences. Academic learning is evaluated after each unit of study. Practical assignments are evaluated as completed and counted toward course completion only when rated as satisfactory or better. If the performance does not meet the satisfactory requirements, it is not counted, and the performance must be repeated. Practical skills are evaluated per text procedures and set forth in practical skills evaluation criteria adapted by the school. Students must maintain a written and practical test grade average of 75%. Students must make up missed tests or incomplete assignments. Incomplete grades are not allowed.

<u>Teaching and Learning Methods:</u> The clock hour education is provided through a sequential set of learning steps which addresses specific tasks necessary for state board preparation, graduation, and job entry level skills. Clinic equipment, implements and products are comparable to those used in the industry. The program is presented through lesson plans which reflect effective education methods. Subjects are presented by means of interactive lectures, demonstration, cooperative learning, labs, student salon activities and student participation. Audio visuals, guest speakers, projects, activities, and other related learning methods are used.
